Dear CASA Lake County Friends and Supporters,

The after-effects of the past few years have led to many changes in the way the world operates. Over the past year, CASA Lake County has worked hard to navigate changes for a new normal in carrying out the agency's mission.

From adapting to the changing landscape of court proceedings, steering dramatic shifts in fundraising, and dedicating a budget that accommodates our growing program, we've grown despite the many challenges. And none of it could have happened without you -- our dedicated community of supporters.

The pandemic changed juvenile court proceedings for abuse and neglect cases in Lake County. The court decided that hearings would be held virtually, instead of in-person, to give parents and families a safer and flexible opportunity for participation. This meant that our staff and CASA volunteers would also have to attend remotely. This year we were able to improve the virtual court experience at our office by installing television monitors with video conferencing cameras and speakers.

Additionally, while individual and corporate fundraising has always been a cornerstone of CASA Lake County's sustainability, this year we were grateful for the opportunity to receive new sources of funding and support from government entities. While the increase in funding provided the means for our CASA program to expand its reach and amplify its positive influence, it also required completing lengthy applications and submitting detailed reports.

As Lake County continued to see an increase in the number of children entering care, we worked to add more staff and volunteers to ensure we could serve as many of the children as possible. Accommodating the needs of those children required careful planning, strategic allocation of resources, and a reevaluation of our budget.

Thank you once again for your dedication to support our mission of ensuring that every child's voice is heard and that they receive the support they deserve. Your support truly makes a difference.

"Why I Volunteer with CASA"



Choosing to volunteer is a personal decision that is often influenced by one's life experiences. When asked what has motivated her to support CASA as long as she has, CASA advocate Susan's answer was remarkable.

"Nothing tugs at my heart more than an innocent child who has become a victim of adults who have lost their way in life." Susan said.

"My parents were both orphaned in the Holocaust; my mom and her four young siblings were saved from their final destination, Auschwitz, by their aunt and uncle in the United States. In essence, they sponsored and became foster parents to my mom and her siblings. In the face of tragedy, my mother flourished in their loving, safe home. Looking back, this is probably what led me to CASA's door. CASA saves children and gives them a fighting chance. CASA supports the family unit when possible. I feel the tug of my heart every day that I am a CASA volunteer."



CASA CARL JOINS "TEAM KURT"

Kurt was only six years old when he was removed from his parents' care because of their ongoing struggles with substance abuse. He had missed about 50 days of school and had fallen one full grade behind. It was clear to family that Kurt was frequently unclean, sleepy, and showed many of the classic signs of developmental delay and neglect. He hadn't been seen for regular medical care and had never received dental or vision care. Kurt suffered five different fractured bones in his arms and wrist over the course of just a few years. He was often withdrawn, sullen, spoke in monotone, and responded to most questions with one-word answers. Due to the trauma he had experienced, Kurt was prone to frustration. When overwhelmed, he might stand up, scream, and even hit others.

As determined by the court, Kurt's grandparents, Will and Heidi, became his foster parents, and CASA volunteer Carl was appointed by the judge to Kurt's case. When Carl first met Kurt, Kurt was mostly mistrustful and closed off. Because of Carl's consistent advocacy, over time he began to earn Kurt's trust. Once this process took hold, Carl was able to build a strong, enduring relationship with Kurt.

Along with Will and Heidi and core members of "Team Kurt," Carl was a consistent and reliable influence in Kurt's life. Carl was able to advocate for Kurt and for the family in multiple ways. He joined Will and Heidi and attended Kurt's open school meetings, special education and educational plan meetings to help advocate for needed services, such as personal and family counseling. In three years, Kurt had multiple caseworkers. Carl maintained contact with the changing parties in Kurt's case – such as his DCFS caseworker and court personnel. Through all the fluid events in Kurt's life, Carl was there, to help provide a strong foundation and a constant presence.

Carl also supported Kurt by developing a supportive partnership with his caregivers, Kurt's grandparents. Carl aided Will and Heidi to better understand and navigate the nuances of the child welfare system. He helped them navigate and understand the-frequently overwhelming—administrative requirements and processes. Most importantly, he acted as their cheerleader – encouraging them when they encountered challenges or frustrations while on the journey.

With the support of Heidi, Will, and Carl, today Kurt is more social, engaged in multiple sports and activities, and in some of his classes is academically about one year ahead of expectations! Kurt has become a well-rounded pre-teen, participating in choir, athletics, attending church, and has a zest for life. He has truly blossomed into the child that we all knew Kurt could be. With steady support from "Team Kurt," his future is bright.

Will and Heidi describe Carl as kind, professional, reliable, and trustworthy. "Without Carl, our experience navigating the child welfare system would have been much more difficult," said Heidi.

Golf for a Child Invitational




